4-H Photo Adventure Camp

4-H Photo Adventure Camp, May 31-June 3, 2015, is an exciting four day photographic experience for teens ages 13-16. The camp, held at Rock Springs 4-H Center, offers hands-on workshops covering a wide range of topics and skills. Campers supply their camera Parents, project leaders and equipment. other 4-H volunteers who have completed the 4-H volunteering screening process are invited to attend camp and learn along with the youth. Enrollment is limited so don't delay in registering for Photo Adventure Camp 2015, which can be found online at kansas4h.org. The registration fee is \$190 for youth or adults. Registration closes April 15, 2015.

Shutterbug Workshop Events

The Photo Action Team has scheduled two Shutterbug workshop events. Shutterbug events provide opportunities for youth to participate in hands-on sessions covering a variety of topics, such as lighting, composition, portraits and posing, camera Q & As, etc. Youth may choose from 7-8 sessions at each location. Dates and details are as follows:

Shutterbugs at Botanica (Wichita) will be held **Saturday**, **April 18th from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.** No pre-registration or other fees are required other than your admission fee into Botanica (Adults \$7; Youth 3-12 \$5).

Shutterbugs at Garden City Zoo (Garden City) will be held **Saturday**, **May 2nd from 9:00 a.m. to 12:30 p.m.** No preregistration is required. There will be a \$5 per person/maximum \$20 per family upon arrival.

Walk Kansas 2015

The 2015 Walk Kansas program will begin March 15th and conclude May 9th. Walk Kansas invites friends, neighbors, family members, and co-workers to form teams of six and track their minutes of physical activity and consumption of fruits and vegetables over the course of eight weeks. Participants have reported multiple benefits from participating in the program including increased energy, a more positive outlook, stress reduction, improved sleep, weight loss, and lower blood pressure.

The cost to enroll in the eight-week program is \$6; which includes registration, incentives, and a weekly newsletter with nutrition and health tips and recipes. Beginner Camp - June 2, 2015

The beginner camp is designed for youth with very little experience judging horses and would like to learn more about note taking and oral reasons. Emphasis will be placed on the placing of classes commonly seen in Kansas judging contests. Objectives: (1) Learn about evaluating horses in different classes, (2) Improve oral reasons, (3) Learn easy note taking skills, (4) Gain individual instruction, (5) Sharpen presentation skills. Classes covered include Stock Type Halter, Western Pleasure, and Hunter Under Saddle.

*Camp registration fee is \$35/person and must be paid by May 10, 2015.

Advanced Camp - June 3-4, 2015

The advanced camp is designed for youth with some experience judging horses and would like to learn more about note taking and oral reasons. Emphasis will be placed on the placing and reasons of classes commonly seen in Kansas judging contests. Objectives: (1) Learn about evaluating horses in different classes, (2) Improve oral reasons, (3) Learn easy note-taking skills, (4) Gain individual instruction, (5) Sharpen presentation skills. Classes covered include Stock Type Halter, Western Pleasure, Hunter Under Saddle, Horsemanship/Equitation, and Reining. Youth will be housed in KSU dorms and will be assigned a roommate. *Camp registration fee is \$120/person and must be paid by May 10, 2015.

Biggest Soybean Plant Contest
